The Goths

The Goths were an East Germanic people; two of whose branches, the Visigoths and the Ostrogoths, played an important role in the fall of the Roman Empire and the emergence of Medieval Europe.

The Visigoths under Alaric I sacked Rome in 410, defeated Attila at the Battle of the Catalaunian Plains in 451, and founded a kingdom in Aquitaine. The Visigoths were pushed to Hispania by the Franks following the Battle of Vouillé in 507. By the late sixth century, the Visigoths had

Mughal Empire

The Mughal Empire was an empire extending over large parts of the Indian subcontinent and ruled by a dynasty of Central Asian origin. The reign of Shah Jahan, the fifth emperor, was the golden age of Mughal architecture. He erected several large monuments, the most famous of which is the Taj Mahal at Agra, as well as the Red Fort, the Jama Masjid (mosque) and the Lal Qila. The last Mughal emperor was deposed by the British authorities in 1857. End of Mughal dynasty.
